Gail Moreau-DesHarnais Burials from L'Assomption-de-la-Pointe-de-Montréal-du-Détroit 1768-1805


Antoine Rousseau *dit* **Lafond**, about 68 years [actually, 63 years], 10 September 1784, buried in the cemetery in the presence of Pageot, Roy, Bigra (Bigras), and several others (Jean François Hubert, p^{tre} *vic gen.*)

Comments: Antoine Rousseau dit Lafond, son of Pierre Rousseau and Catherine Desalliers/DesSelliers (sic) was married twice: (1) Marie Anne Petit, daughter of Louis Petit and Marie Angélique Simon dite Léonard, 2 May 1757 at Pointe-aux-Trembles. They were the parents of four children, three of whom survived, married, and left descendents in present-day Québec; (2) Marie Josèphe Morin, daughter of the deceased Pierre Morin and the deceased Marie Joseph D'aune (Josèphe Daunay) [and widow of Louis Villers dit St. Louis], 30 January 1779 in L'Assomption de Sandwich. They left no descendants.

Antoine Rouchau, son of Pierre Rouchau/Rouchaut and Catherine De Cibier, was born 4 June 1719 in the village of Nayrague and and baptized 7 June 1719 in Cressensac, department of Lot, France. Pierre Rouchaut from Nayrague [no parents named] married Catherine De Cibier from La Salasse, parish of Pauliac (Paulhac) in the diocese of St-Flour in Auvergne [department of Cantal] 28 July 1718 in Cressensac. Catherine De Cibier, aged about 45, was buried 8 December 1722 in Cressenac; she died in the village of Mayringnac.

The following excerpt about Antoine Roucheau (Rousseau) dit Lafond, is from Combattre pour la France en Amérique [my translation]. "A soldier in the Guyenne Regiment, company of Launay in 1755, hired 22 May 1740 as a soldier. He was born in 1720 [sic- 4 June 1719] in Cressensac (St-Barthelémy), Lot, son of Pierre Roucheau [sic – Rouchau] and Catherine Desselière [sic-De Cibier]. ... Physical Characteristics: 5 feet, 5 inches, and "5 lines" [5 pieds 5 pouces et 8 lignes], brown hair and brown eyebrows, the forehead large and exposed [le front grand et découvert], deep brown eyes, an aquiline nose, a large mouth, the lower lip a little big, a round and full chin, and a swarthy face."
